You are invited to participate in the Annual Meeting of the American Society of Clinical Psychopharmacology (ASCP) to be held at the Loews Miami Beach Hotel on June 01-04, 2021 by submitting a proposal and attending the meeting. The committee welcomes submissions from the U.S. as well as international proposals, and this year the committee strongly encourages the composition of panels and workshops that include women, under-represented minorities and early career scientists and clinicians.

This year's meeting theme is 'Integrating New and Novel Treatments into Clinical Practice and Education'.
